## Summer School

This year, New Bridge School summer school ran from 26<sup>th</sup> July 2021 – 20<sup>th</sup> August 2021 and was aimed at all students across school. The summer school included a mix of academic and enrichment activity. Throughout the week's students completed a variety of different activities to help meet the learning and development needs of students, their families and local community. We offered places on the summer school to every child within New Bridge regardless of need.

Our activities were designed to support learning, raise school standards, promote healthy lifestyles and support our working parents. In addition, as we are a special educational needs school we offered continuity of care for those students on the Autistic spectrum who need this throughout the holiday period. This enables school to work closely with members of the wider community and connect local people with local services.

Some examples of activities offered include:

- Sport including boccia, tag rugby, team relay, swimming, basketball, dodge ball, badminton, bouncy castle, didi cars, target throw and archery
- Art and craft
- Drama, with an emphasis on mental health and wellbeing however this also runs through all activities and outings



- ICT including iPads
- Educational visits to Blackpool Zoo and local parks
- On site visits from local farms, animal and reptile handlers
- Sensory activities
- Specialist provision and activities for bespoke students
- Maths and English are incorporated into all activities dependent upon the ability of the students

The summer school was an invaluable experience in both giving students the support they needed academically and also supporting them in their mental wellbeing.

The holiday club was staffed with qualified teaching staff, support assistants, apprentices, pastoral staff and administrative staff. In addition, we offered the opportunity for volunteers to work alongside regular staff to support students and gain experience.

Due to being a special educational needs school we also had personal care staff and medication support staff to support all student needs. The Director of Care and Director of Extended Schools attended to manage the organisation and implementation of the planning and day to day running of the summer school.
